To the Budget Committee & Board of Selectmen:

Our organization is requesting the sum of \$3,972.00 from the Town of Effingham for the 2020 budget year.

Starting Point: Services for Victims of Domestic & Sexual Violence is a non-profit agency that provides services for victims of Domestic Violence, Sexual Violence and Stalking in Carroll County. Our organization provides crisis services within the community and works closely within the criminal justice system to ensure that the victim's rights are observed.

By calling our 24-hour crisis line, a victim can access a Starting Point Advocate 24x7x365 and receive crisis intervention services, emergency shelter, hospital accompaniment and, if needed, transportation services. All services are offered at no charge.

In addition to crisis services, we offer follow up assistance through peer led support groups, case management and social service advocacy. We also provide community outreach services.

Residents of the Town of Effingham received the following core services from Starting Point's staff and volunteers during the period of July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019:

- 6.47% of Starting Point's victims were Effingham residents.
- 9.73% of Starting Point's overall services were provided to Effingham residents.
- Starting Point provided 30 Effingham residents with 477 services some of which included: crisis intervention, court advocacy, Child Advocacy Center accompaniment, in-person support and numerous referrals to a variety of social service providers.

We urge you to encourage and support programs and laws that protect our residents from victimization. Only then can we ensure a safer community for ourselves and our children.

Starting Point: Services for Victims of Domestic & Sexual Violence is a non-profit organization dedicated to

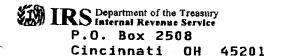
- Ensuring quality services are provided to victims of relationship violence and sexual abuse;
