Annual Town Meeting March 16, 2024

The Following are the results from the Town Election, which was held on Tuesday, March 12, 2024. The checklist reads 1095 voters. 294 ballots were cast, including 4 absentee ballots.

The Town Meeting was called to order at 9:00 am on Saturday, March 16, 2024. The Town Meeting had 80 registered voters in attendance. Moderator Pittman started with The Pledge of Allegiance. Moderator Pittman thanked and acknowledged our Veterans and present military, and Ems, and our Police Officers. Moderator Pittman mentioned housekeeping tips for The Town Meeting.

Moderator Pittman thanked Principal Morrissey, Pam Buswell, and Mark McKinley, of Effingham Elementary School, for all their help and cooperation in using the school for our Elections and The Town Meeting, and for all they do with setting up. Moderator Pittman thanked our Supervisors of the Checklist, and especially acknowledged Cheryle Feirick, who is stepping down as Supervisor of the Checklist after many years of service.

Moderator Pittman invited Chris Seamans to introduce and recognize Chief Tyler Eldridge's promotion to Chief, and Sergeant Brian Baker to Sergeant. Newest Patrol Officer Brandon Jendrock, and K-9 Jesse was also mentioned.

Moderator Pittman recognized Irene Riordan. Irene passed away at 88 on December 23, 2023. Irene was passionate about our Library and The South Effingham Church, but she was most remembered for her love of horse racing, especially the Kentucky Derby, which she would be sure to be watching on TV. Moderator Pittman mentioned a memorial service for Irene on April 20, 2024 at 10:00 am, at The South Effingham Church, with a reception following at The Parsonsfield Seminary.

Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment 2023-1 as recommended by the Planning Board for the Town Ordinance as follows:

Amend Article 22 section 2208, 2211, and 2212 to clarify the role of the Fire Chief in Spill Prevention Control and Counter Measures Plans. Notification requirements to the Fire Chief and Conservation Commission remains unchanged.

Article 3. Fire Truck and Equipment CRF

Shall the Town vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000 to be added to the Fire Truck and Equipment Capital Reserve Fund. This sum is to come from the unassigned fund balance (which represents money received from the Town of Parsonsfield for Fire Department Mutual aid). No amount to be raised from taxation. This is a special warrant article. Majority vote required. The Budget Committee and the Board of Selectmen recommend this article. **Article moved by Lenny Espie 2**nd **by Chris Seamans Article passed by unanimous consent.**

Article 04. Fire Department Equipment ETF

Shall the Town vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$20,000 to be added to the Fire Department Equipment Expendable Trust Fund. This sum is to come from the unassigned fund balance. No amount to be raised from taxation. This is a special warrant article. Majority vote required. The Budget Committee and the Board of Selectmen recommend this article. The Budget Committee and the Board of Selectmen recommend this article.

Article 05. Fire Truck and Fire Truck Equipment CRF

Shall the Town vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$70,000 to be added to the Fire Truck and Equipment Capital Reserve Fund. The sum of \$20,000 is to be raised from taxation and \$50,000 is to come from the unassigned fund balance. This is a special warrant article. Majority vote required. The Budget Committee and the Board of Selectmen recommend this article.

The Budget Committee and the Board of Selectmen recommend this article. 2nd by Leo Racine Article moved by Chris Seamans

Shall the Town vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250,000 to pave 0.77 miles of Ryefield road? The sum of \$250,000 is to come from taxation. This is a special warrant article. Majority vote required. The Budget Committee and the Board of Selectmen recommend this article.

No amount is to be raised from taxation. This is a special warrant article. Majority vote required. The Budget Committee and the Board of Selectmen recommend this article. **Article moved by Chris Seamans Article passed by unanimous consent**

Article 16. Voting Machine ETF

Shall the Town vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500 to be added to the Voting Machine Expendable Trust Fund. This sum is to come from the unassigned fund balance. No amount is to be raised from taxation. This is a special warrant article. The Selectmen and the Budget Committee recommend this appropriation. (Majority vote required)

Article 17. Town Hall Repair and Rehabilitation ETF

Shall the Town vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$15,000 to be added to the Town Hall Repair and Rehabilitation Expendable Trust Fund. The sum of \$10,000 is to be raised from taxation and \$5,000 is to come from the unassigned fund balance. This is a special warrant article. The Selectmen and the Budget Committee recommend this appropriation. (Majority vote required) Article moved by Chuck Fuller Article passed by unanimous consent Erik Jones motion to restrict Articles 10-17 Motion passed by unanimous consent

Article 18. Emergency Management Generator Replacement ETF

Shall the Town vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$22,500 to be added to the Emergency Management Generator Replacement Expendable Trust Fund. This sum is to come from the unassigned fund balance. No amount is to be raised from taxation. This is a special warrant article. Majority vote required. The Budget Committee and the Board of Selectmen recommend this article.

Article 24. Set up Heritage Commission

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Historic District Commission, already established, to assume the composition and additional duties of a Heritage Commission as authorized by RSA 675:6. V and RSA 674:44-b; and further to increase its membership from the current five (5) members to seven (7) members, as authorized by RSA 673:4.

The Board of Selectmen and Budget Committee recommend this article. 2nd by Leo Racine Article moved by Chris Seamans Article passed by Majority consent, 1 NO

Article 20. This appropriation would allow repair of Engine 2

Shall the Town vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250,000 to Refurbish Engine 2 Pumper? The sum of \$250,000 is to come from the Capital Reserve Fund Fire Truck & Equipment. No amount to be raised from taxation. This is a special warrant article. Majority vote required. The Budget Committee and the Board of Selectmen recommend this article.

Article 21. This appropriation is for the purchase of a repeater

No amount is to be raised from taxation. This is a special warrant article. Majority vote required. The Budget Committee and the Board of Selectmen recommend this article.

Article 23. Appointment of Town Treasurer

Shall the Town vote to change the office of Town Treasurer from an elected position to an appointed position in accordance with RSA 41:26-e. If approved the person holding the elected office shall continue to hold such office until the next annual town election following the vote. (No Tax Impact) (Majority vote required) The Board of Selectmen recommend this article.
